## **Glossary of Key Terms**:

**Anti-Triumphalism:** The rejection of a showy or boastful display of victory, often through an inversion of expectations.

**Arbitrage**: The practice of taking advantage of a price difference between two or more markets. The speaker uses the term "Cozy Arbitrage" to describe how the temple leaders used their religious position to their financial benefit.

**Chief Priests and Teachers of the Law:** Religious elite in Jesus' time responsible for interpreting the Jewish law and overseeing temple worship and practice.

**Court of the Gentiles:** An outer court in the Temple complex where Gentiles (non-Jews) were allowed to enter but was not part of the Temple proper.

**Den of Robbers:** A phrase used by Jesus quoting the prophet Jeremiah (7:11), criticizing the Temple for its corruption and exploitation.

**House of Prayer:** A phrase used by Jesus quoting the prophet Isaiah (56:7), to underscore the Temple's intended purpose of worship and communion with God.

**Humiliation**: The act of causing someone to feel ashamed or embarrassed; in this text, the religious leaders were embarrassed and humiliated when their corruption was revealed.

**Indignant**: Feeling or showing anger or annoyance at what is perceived as unfair treatment.

Mishna: A major written collection of Jewish oral traditions and laws.

Passover: A Jewish festival commemorating the liberation of the Israelites from slavery in Egypt.

**Shekel**: An ancient coin, and the proper currency for paying the Temple tax.

**Temple Tax:** An annual tax required of all Jewish men to support the Temple in Jerusalem.
